

Overview

The MyJax Community Connect dashboard provides a comprehensive overview of how the City of Jacksonville allocates resources across 10 quality-of-life community goals as outlined in the Community Goals Framework.

The charts and tables in the dashboard serve as an interactive snapshot of the City of Jacksonville's investments for fiscal years 2019 to 2022. The City of Jacksonville is committed to leveraging data-driven, decision-making to create positive outcomes for Jacksonville residents. This dashboard is an essential tool in that effort.


Quality-of-Life dashboard

Access MyJax Community Connect (coj.net). Click **Dashboard** on the top menu bar. Under the **Quality of Life** dashboard (shown below), users may filter the Quality-of-Life funding investment data to view multiple perspectives of how the City of Jacksonville strategically leverages city dollars as well as private, philanthropic, and state and federal funds.

Dashboard users can filter the funding data by community goal or oversight department. Click **Reset** to return the data to the preset selection of all departments, all community goals, and total investment.

The **Community Goal(s)** and **Department(s)** filter boxes offer a checkbox selection option that allows users to select all, multiple options, or one specific goal and/or department.

For the **Fiscal Year** selection box, users have the option to view data for fiscal years 2019-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022, or all three fiscal years combined. Note that a City of Jacksonville fiscal year runs from October 1 to September 30.



Community Goals Framework (CGF)

The Community Goals Framework (CGF) pie chart and table (shown above) illustrates the investment percentage and total dollar amount invested in each of the 10 quality-of-life community goals. For a complete list of these goals, access: www.nonprofits.coj.net/CGF.


Mouse-over the individual sections to view the goal name and the investment amount percentage.

To see percentages and totals breakdown by department, filter the drop-down options to select multiple departments or one specific department.



Investments by Community Goal or Department bar graphs

These two bar graphs provide a dynamic view of the department and community goal investment data that illustrate the same data intersection from two different perspectives. These charts highlight how departments are tackling different components of key quality-of-life issues as well as how community goals are integrated within every department. The example below illustrates Investment by Community Goal(s).



This stacked bar graph highlights the diversity in community goal investment by each department. This is a dynamic chart that will change based on the filtration selections, and the graph allows users to place their curser over each bar graph section to view the goal name, department name and the funding amount.



Investments table

This table details the specific investment data that is highlighted in the dashboard's pie chart and bar graphs. This is a dynamic table that will change based on the filtration selections. The column headings at the top of the table allow users to sort investments alphabetically and numerically, and the bottom of the table provides users with the option to view more investments per page.
